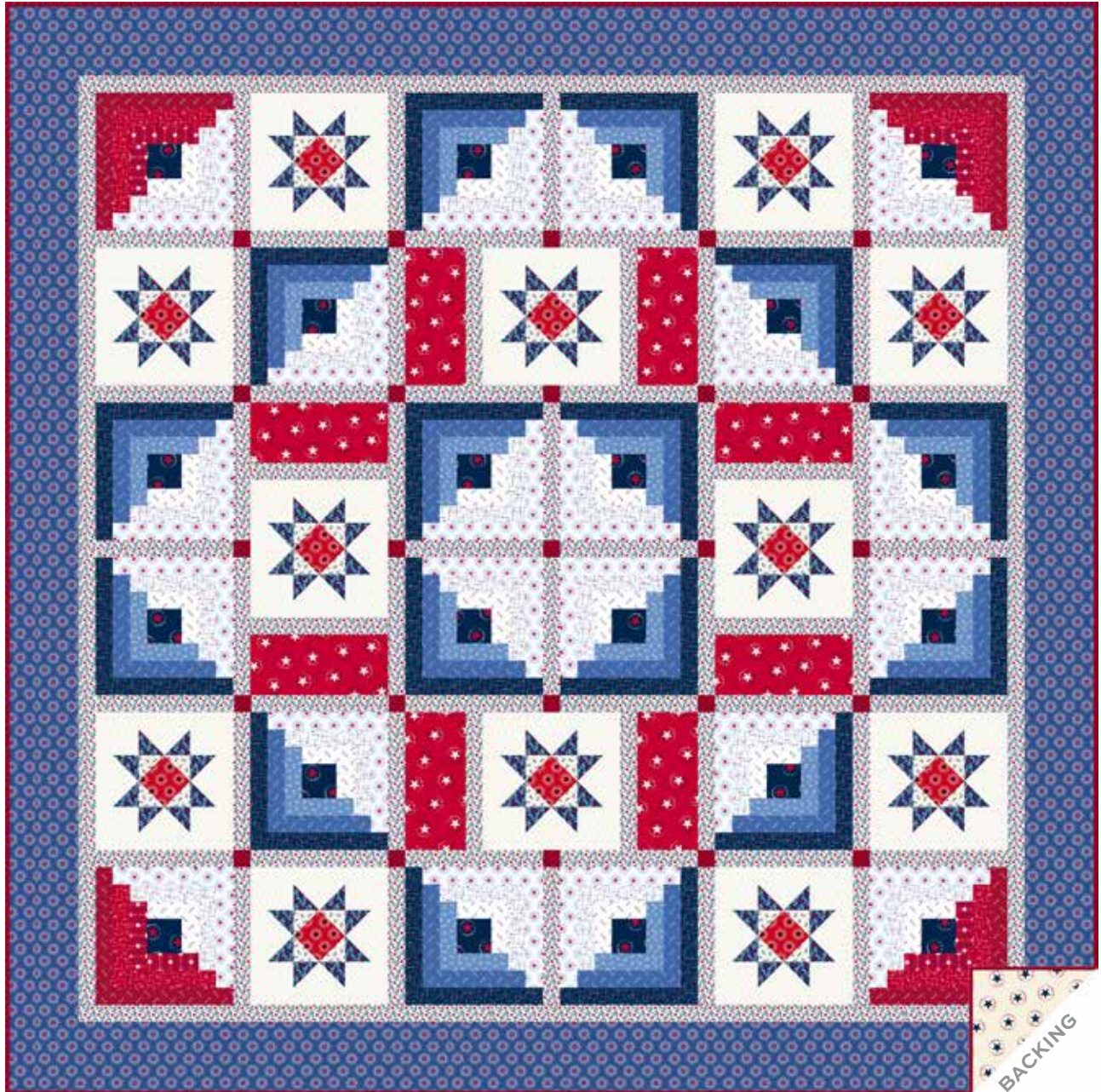

This lovely tribute to red-white-and-blue patriotism is made with two traditional blocks from America's quilting past. The Log Cabin and Sawtooth Star blocks come together in this graphic medallion setting that is just the right size to be the focal point in any room.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. A fat ⅛ is a 9" x 20"-22" cut of fabric. A fat ¼ is an 18" x 20"-22" cut. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ¼" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric A Cut (20) squares 2½"

Fabric B Cut (8) rectangles 4" x 8½"

Fabric C Cut (4) rectangles 1½" x 4½"
Cut (4) rectangles 1½" x 3½"

Fabric D Cut (2) top/bottom borders 4½" x 63½"
Cut (2) side borders 4½" x 55½"

Fabric E Cut (20) rectangles 1½" x 7½"
Cut (20) rectangles 1½" x 6½"

Fabric F Cut (12) squares 3½"

Fabric G Cut (16) rectangles 1½" x 8½"
Cut (16) rectangles 1½" x 7½"

Fabric H Cut (20) rectangles 1½" x 5½"
Cut (20) rectangles 1½" x 4½"

Fabric I Cut (4) rectangles 1½" x 6½"
Cut (4) rectangles 1½" x 5½"

Fabric J Cut (96) squares 2"

Fabric K Cut (24) rectangles 1½" x 8½"
Cut (24) rectangles 1½" x 6½"
Cut (48) rectangles 2" x 3½"
Cut (48) squares 2"

Fabric L Cut (2) top/bottom borders 1½" x 55½"
Cut (2) side borders 1½" x 53½"
Cut (64) sashes 1½" x 8½"

Fabric O Cut (4) rectangles 1½" x 8½"
Cut (4) rectangles 1½" x 7½"

Fabric P Cut (16) rectangles 1½" x 4½"
Cut (16) rectangles 1½" x 3½"

Fabric Q Cut (48) squares 2"

Fabric R Cut (25) squares 1½"

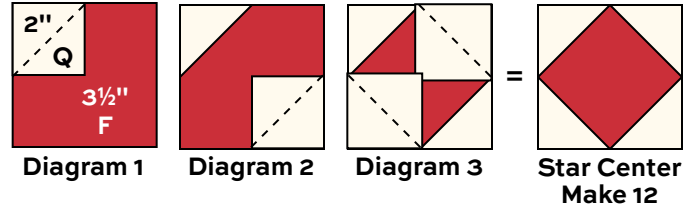
Binding Cut (7) strips 2½" x WOF for binding

Backing Cut (2) lengths 37" x 73", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

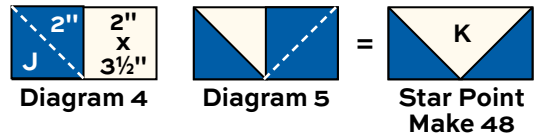

Making the Quilt

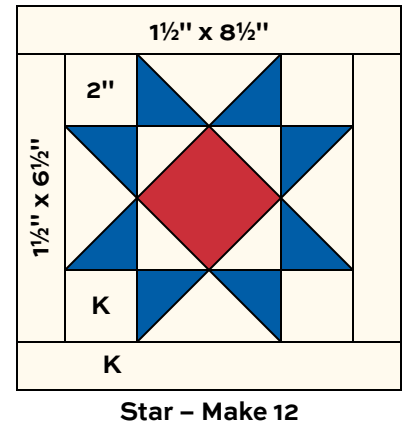
1. The Star block has a center made with an easy stitch-and-flip method. Draw a diagonal line on the back side of Fabric Q squares. With right sides together, position a marked square on one corner of a Fabric F square (Diagram 1). Stitch on the marked diagonal line. Cut away the excess fabric. Press the corner up. Repeat this step on the opposite corner (Diagram 2). Stitch 2 more squares on remaining corners (Diagram 3). The unit should measure 3½" square. Make 12 Star centers. Set aside.



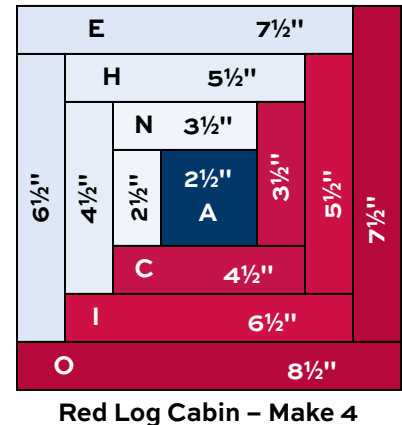
2. Fast Flying Geese are used in the Star blocks. Draw a diagonal line on the back side of Fabric J squares. Position a marked square as shown on one end of a Fabric K rectangle (Diagram 4). Stitch on the marked diagonal line. Cut away the excess fabric. Press the corner up. Repeat this step on the opposite end of the rectangle (Diagram 5). Cut away the excess fabric and press corner up. The unit should measure 2" x 3½". Make 48 Star Point units.



3. Referring to the Star block diagram, sew a Star Point unit to opposite sides of a Center unit. Press seam allowances toward the center. Sew Fabric K 2" squares to ends of 2 Star Point units. Press seam allowances toward the 2" squares. Sew these to the top and bottom of the block. Press seam allowances away from the center. Finally, sew Fabric K 6½" rectangles to the sides, and then sew 8½" rectangles to the top and bottom. The block should measure 8½" square. Make 12 Star blocks.

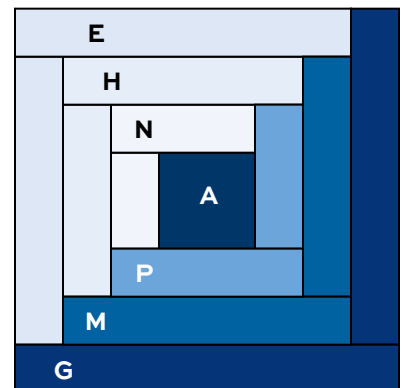


4. Refer to the Log Cabin block diagrams to join the appropriate strips to each Fabric A 2½" square, working in a clockwise direction. Press seam allowances away from the center. The block should measure 8½" square. Make 4 Red Log Cabin blocks and 16 Blue Log Cabin blocks.



5. Refer to the Quilt Assembly for the following steps. Join 6 Fabric L sashes alternately with 5 Fabric R squares. Make 4 pieced sashes like this. Set aside.

6. On a large flat surface, arrange the blocks, Fabric L sashes, and Fabric B rectangles in horizontal rows, noting the placement and orientation of the red and blue Log Cabin blocks. The middle 2 rows must be joined as shown, including the sashes and setting squares. Look through the wrong end of binoculars or through a camera to see any parts out of place. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the parts into rows.



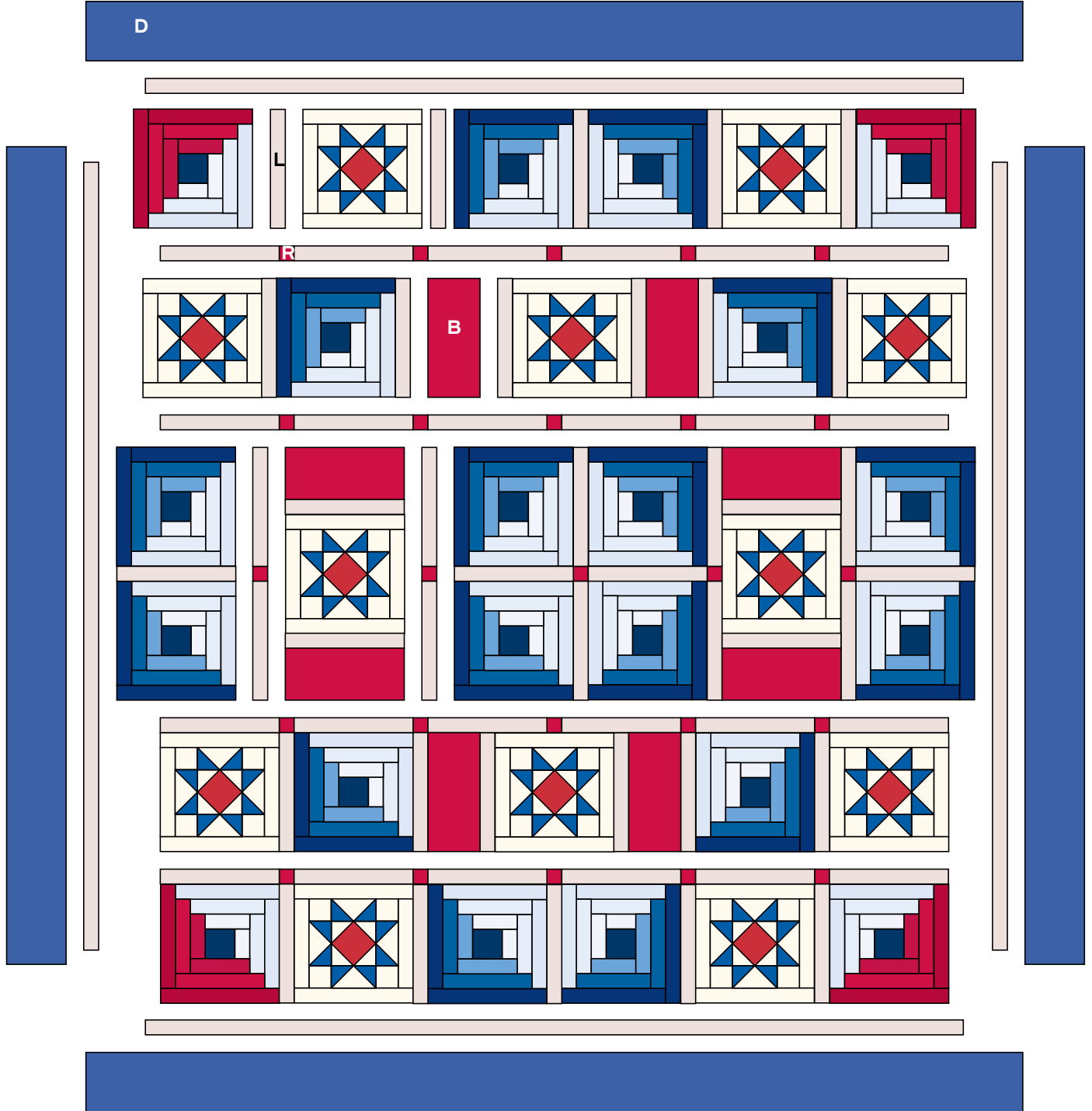
7. Sew pieced sashes from Step 5 between the rows from Step 6.

8. Sew short Fabric L borders to the sides. Sew long Fabric L borders to top and bottom. Likewise, join Fabric D borders to the quilt.

Finishing the Quilt

9. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and patches. Quilt Fabric B patches, Star blocks, and outer borders as you wish. Bind to finish the quilt.

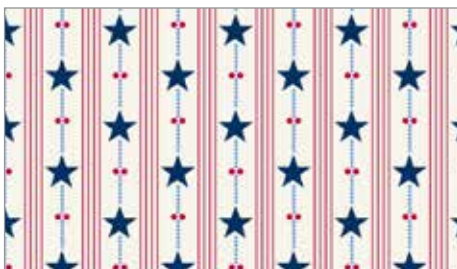

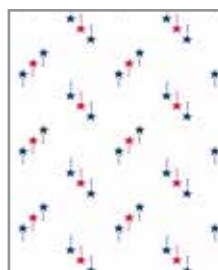
