## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

### For the Darker Version:

- 2625-P Center – One Panel  
 2629-P Inner Border & Geese –  $\frac{1}{3}$  yd  
 2626-K Stripe Border –  $1\frac{1}{4}$  yds  
 2630-K Geese Background – 1 yd  
 2627-G, 2628-E, } Geese in Pieced  
 2628-B, 2628-G, } Border –  $\frac{1}{4}$  yd  
 2629-Y, 2629-B, } each of nine fabrics  
 2630-P, 2630-R, }  
 2630-Y

### For the Lighter Version:

- 2625-LP Center – One Panel  
 2630-LP Inner Border & Geese –  $\frac{1}{3}$  yd  
 2626-B Stripe Border –  $1\frac{1}{4}$  yds  
 2628-LG Geese Background – 1 yd  
 2627-LG, 2628-LE, } Geese in Pieced  
 2628-LB, 2629-T, } Border –  $\frac{1}{4}$  yd  
 2629-LP, 2629-LY, } each of eight fabrics  
 2630-Y, 2630-E

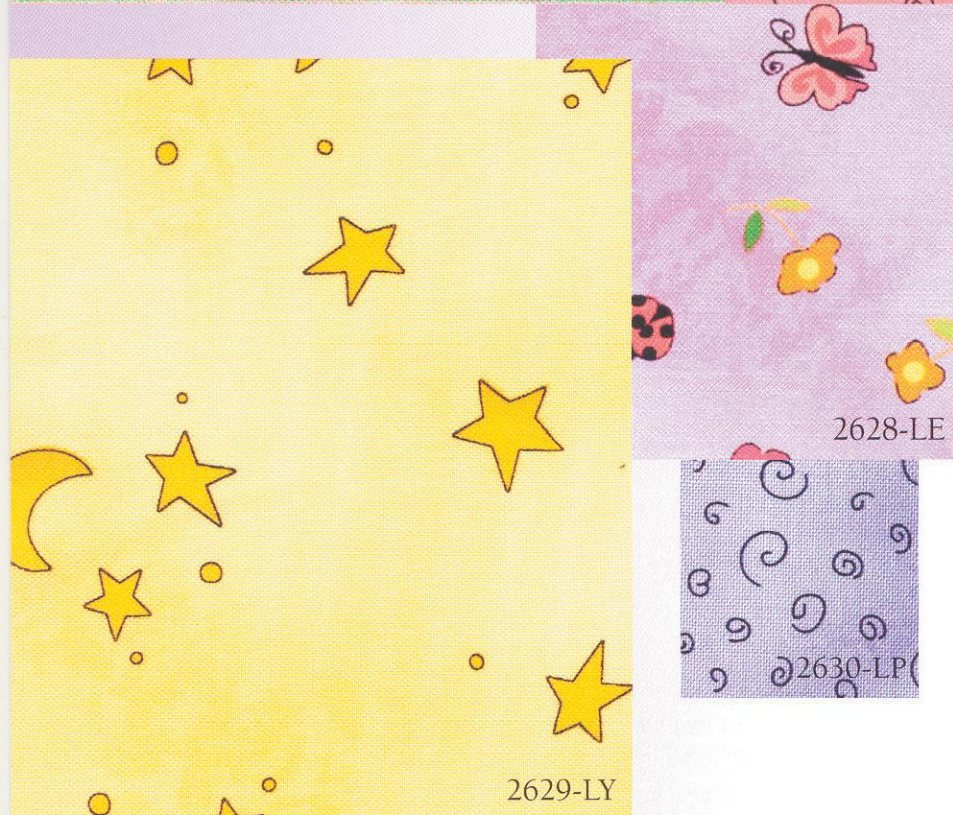
Backing –  $3\frac{1}{4}$  yd

Binding –  $\frac{3}{4}$  yd (finished width  $\frac{1}{2}$ " )

## CUTTING DIRECTIONS:

**Note: Do NOT prewash fabrics. The panel will shrink with washing and will not be size needed for construction. The quilt may be washed after it is completed.**

- ♦ Cut the top part of the panel to measure  $23\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $34\frac{1}{2}$ ". To separate the bottom three blocks, cut along the top edge of the black border. Measure up  $34\frac{1}{2}$ " on each side of the panel and pin to mark. Cut across the top using the pins as a guide. For the  $23\frac{1}{2}$ " width, measure  $\frac{3}{8}$ " from the black border on each side of the center design. Double check the measurements before making each cut.

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The three blocks across the bottom of the panel will be used in the corners. Cut each of the three blocks to a 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" square. Be sure to center the design within each square.

♦ **Inner border:**

Cut four strips 1 1/2" wide. Cut two strips to measure 34 1/2" in length. Cut the remaining two strips to measure 25 1/2" in length.

♦ **Stripe border:**

Cut two strips 4 1/2" x 36 1/2". Cut two strips 3 1/2" x 33 1/2". To isolate various stripe designs - center the desired design within the cutting measurement. Cut the along the length of the fabric for each stripe. *Note: We chose to use four different stripe designs, if you choose to use the same stripe for each side you will need to purchase an extra yard.*

♦ **Corner Square:**

Cut one 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" square from a blue fabric. Cut one 6" x 6" square from both a pink fabric and a red fabric for the hearts.

♦ **Pieced Geese Border:**

From the background fabric, cut nine strips 3 1/2" wide. Cut each strip into 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares. 100 squares are needed.

From each of the geese fabrics, cut one strip 3 1/2" wide. Cut each strip into 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles. There will be a few extra rectangles, pick 50 for the geese.

## ASSEMBLY OF THE QUILT TOP:

### Inner Borders:

- 1) Sew the two 34 1/2" strips to each side of the panel. Press seam allowances towards the border.
- 2) Sew the two 25 1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the panel. Press seam allowances towards the inner border.

### Stripe Borders:

- 3) Sew a 4 1/2" x 36 1/2" stripe to each side of the quilt top. Press seam allowances towards the center.
- 4) Sew 3 1/2" x 33 1/2" stripe to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press seam allowances towards the center.

### Corner Square:

5) Using the applique method of your choice, apply the two hearts to the blue 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" corner square. Use the red and pink 6" x 6" fabric squares cut earlier for each heart.

### Pieced Geese Border:

6) With right sides together, place one 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" background square on top of one 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" goose rectangle. Line up raw edges, sew along the diagonal, see illustration 1. Press back half of square along sewing line towards the corner. See illustration 2.

7) With right sides together, place a 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" background square on top of the goose rectangle. See illustration 3. Sew along the diagonal and press over as in step 6. See illustration 4.

8) Arrange the geese in two rows of 11 and two rows of 14. Be sure all the geese are pointing in the same direction within each row. Sew each row of geese together and press seam allowances towards each goose.

9) Sew a 14 geese row to each side of the quilt top. Press seam allowances towards the center.

10) Sew a 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" corner square to each end of the 11 geese rows. Press seam allowance towards the corner square. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press seam allowances towards the center.

## FINISHING THE QUILT:

11) Layer quilt with batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Press quilt. Cut off extra batting and backing fabric 1/4" larger than pieced quilt top. It is being cut larger to allow for the larger seam allowance and binding. A rotary cutter and ruler make this step much easier.

12) Cut six strips 3" wide from binding fabric. Join strips with a diagonal seam into one continuous strip. Press seam allowances open. Press the strip in half along the length.

13) Sew the binding to the edge of the quilt with raw edges even and front of the quilt facing up. Sew with a 1/2" sewn allowance. Hand sew binding to back of quilt.

14) Use the hearts appliqued on the front corner as a label or apply a label to the back of the quilt.
